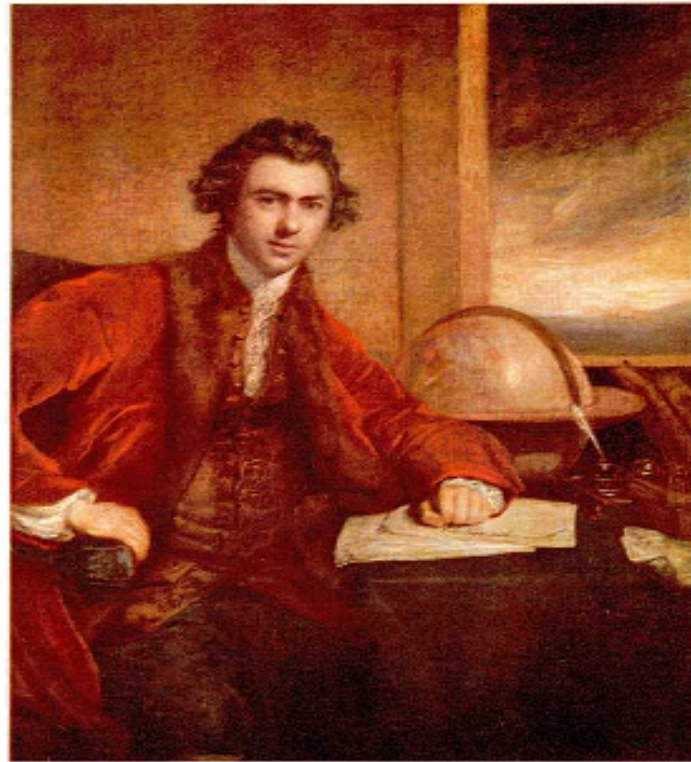

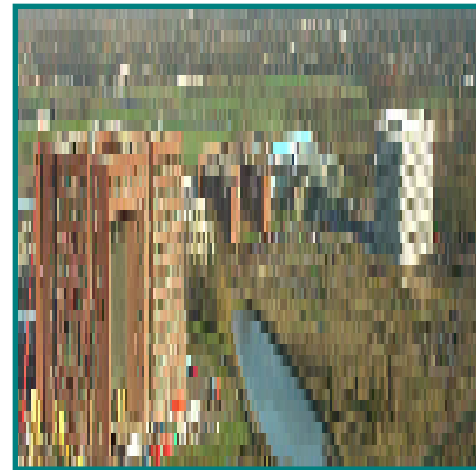

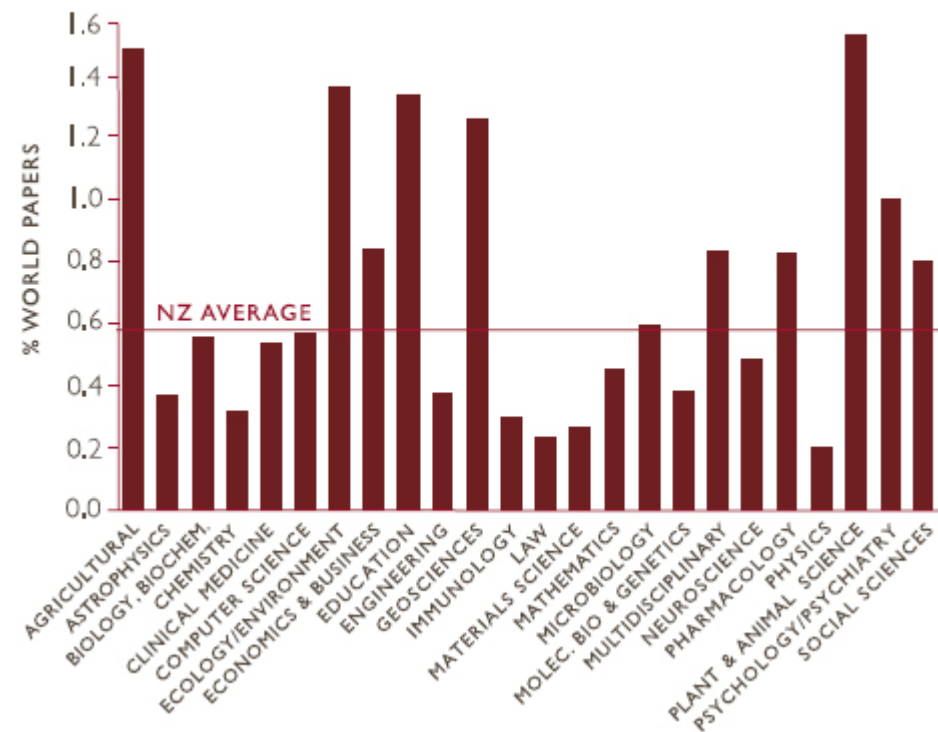


Importance of International Linkages

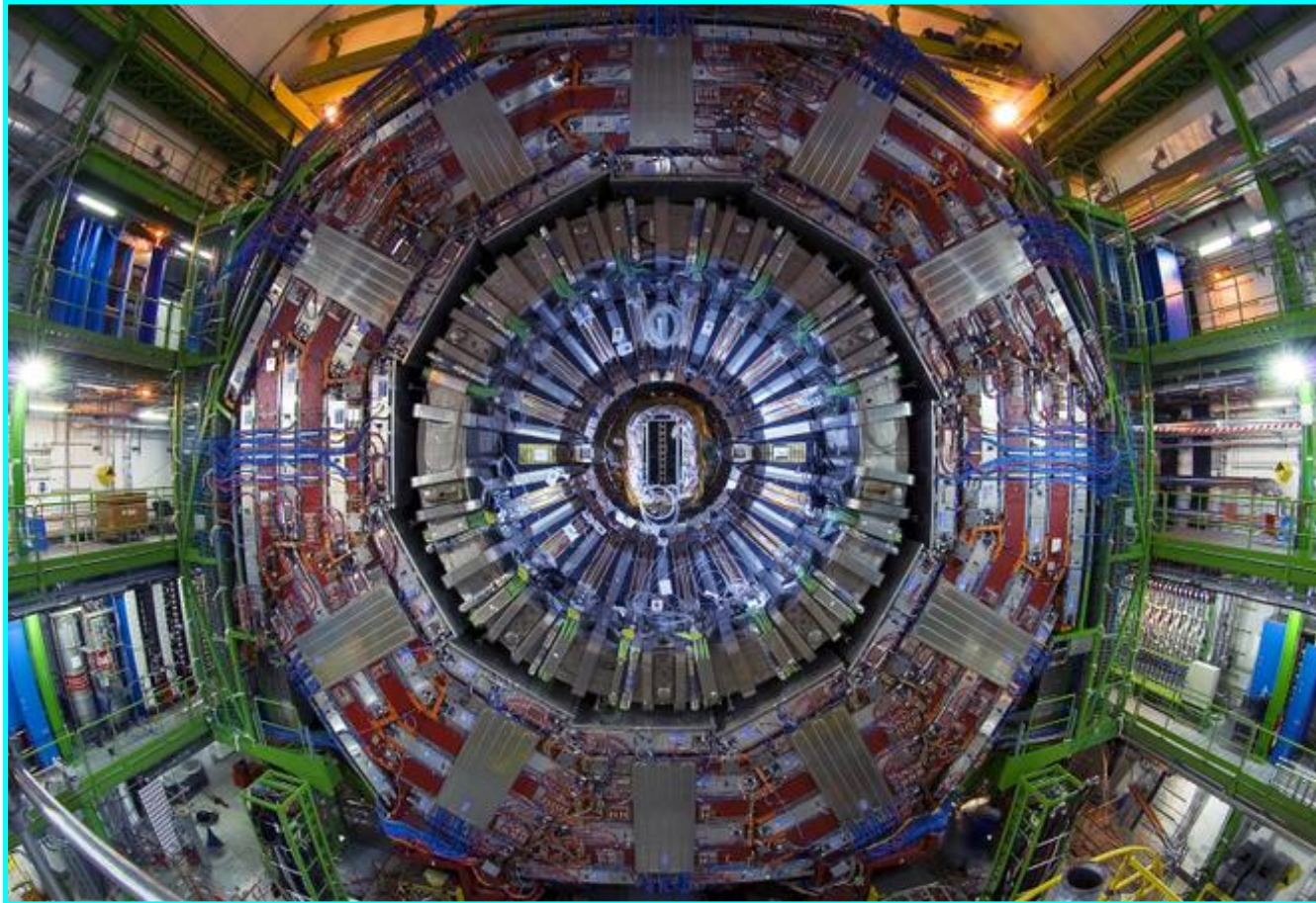

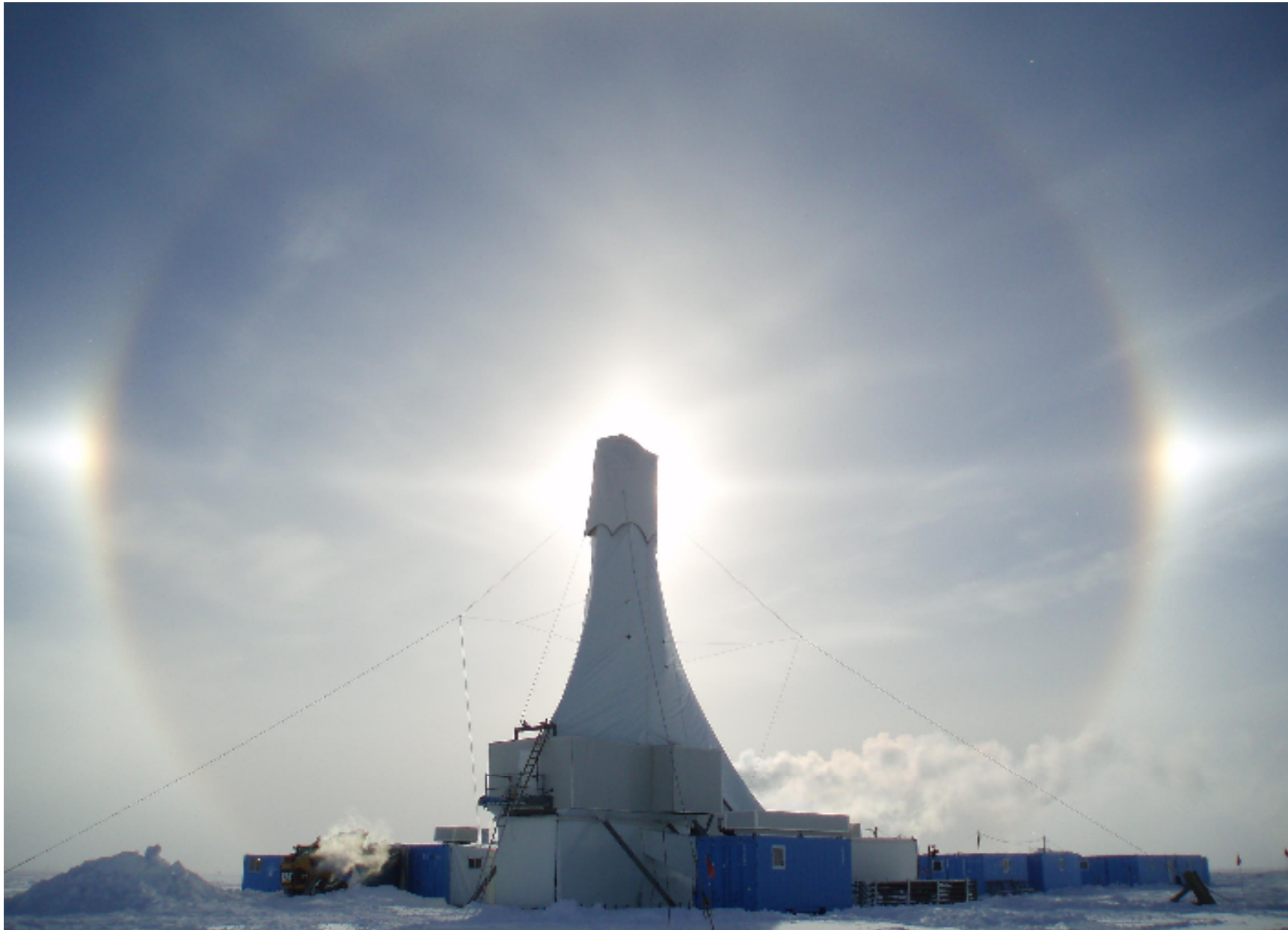
